# **MANDATORY AES**

- Expect final AES details in a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking issued in September 2004. The Comment period will close in November 2004 and the final rule will be implemented in March 2005.
- Applications for AES Option 4, post-departure filing of export information. again accepted.

### **CARGO SECURITY - WCO**

The WCO adopted a global security-facilitation strategy that will look like an internationalized version of C-TPAT/CSI effective June 2005.
